Mayor Rominger opened the meeting and asked Council Member Borchard to chair.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Public comment was received from Michael Contreras who questioned a portion of the draft City Strategic Plan recommendations. City Manager Kris Kristensen responded to the question.

IMPLEMENTATION OF "MEGAN'S LAW" LOCALLY:

Police Chief Smith introduced Lieutenant Charlie Wilts who outlined 1996 Federal and State laws dealing with the post-incarceration registration of criminals convicted of sex based or other violent crimes, and related public access available on these registrations. The laws effect about 70,000 criminals currently residing in California. Registrants are classified by the seriousness of their crimes: "High Risk" (about 2% of the State total), "Serious" (80%), and "Other" (18%).

Crime Analyst Rothrock profiled the 99 criminals registered under these laws that are currently residing in Woodland. None of the registrants were in the High Risk classification; 82% were classified as Serious, and 18% were Other. All but two of the registrants were male and 68% were between 30-49 years of age.

The Council was provided with the Police Department's planned policy for the local implementation of these laws and responded to questions
