April Water Use "Dashboard" and Water Conservation News

[Click here](#) for the April water use update. In April, Environmental Services distributed water conservation information at the Yolo County Home and Landscape Show and the Downtown Woodland Sidewalk Sale. Staff answered questions on water conservation, water meters and sample bills. The City distributed the first sample water bills for residences with water meters to provide water meter customers with information on how water usage will affect their total utility bill when consumption-based billing begins later this year. In addition, water conservation letters were sent to the water customers at metered residences with water use higher than 30 hundred cubic feet (22,440) gallons) for the month of March. The average use for metered residences in March was 11 units (8,229 gallons).
